New Business:

Economic Development- Discussion regarding assisting any potential buyer of the Catholic Church property by offering to enter into some type of agreement for tying into the Town's septic system. The property currently has no water or septic and the size of the property limits what a potential buyer would be able to do. The Town Board wants to help in any way possible to make the property more viable for developing. Councilman Hill says the buyer would have to share some cost of using the septic, but that could be determined later. Councilman Olson agreed that taxpayers should "not be on the hook for costs". Supervisor Bentley said the sewer was designed for the school, so we have plenty of leeway with room. Supervisor Bentley said that Counselor Schachner said there would be no problem working out some type of agreement. After further discussion regarding leech-field and logistics of pumping, the Board members were all in agreement to do this for nominal fee to tie in.

Economic Development Effort- Councilman Olson said he has been working on behalf of the Town to look for ways to attract attention to our Community. Councilman Olson spoke of the formation of the Mill Pond District and said we need to be pro-active about this and push for help. Councilman Olson has asked Town Historian Colleen Murtagh to work out a special date for a summer celebration.

Tom Johansen said that August 1st is the Craft Fair at the Horicon Community Center and perhaps something could be worked around that. Councilman Dooris said he is working on "exploratory committee ideas" that would include community groups such as the Fire Company, Scouts, Chamber of Commerce, Friends of Library and perhaps the Youth Group through Nancy Harrison. Councilman Dooris would like to see the fireworks and games like the Town used to have. Hopefully we can come up with a program for the summer of 2010. Supervisor Bentley said bed tax money could be used for fireworks and planning such an undertaking. Councilman Dooris will start working on a list of names of people who have shown interest and bring it to the Board next month. Tom Johansen said that years ago Horicon had a Fair and it would be nice to bring that back. Councilman Olson said he would be glad to work on it with Councilman Dooris.

Training for ZBA & Planning Members: Councilman Dooris spoke of the 4 hours of mandated training for members of these Boards and suggested it be changed to 6 hours of mandated training. He also wants to look into having another training session here, like

the one Mark Schachner did last year. Councilman Dooris said we need to give new people as much help as possible and Councilman Olson added "if we have it here we can gear it to rural area". Councilman Olson said NYS has specific courses for new Planning and Zoning Board members and he will contact the Department of State to see if they still offer courses for new members.

Direct Deposit: Councilman Hill said that some employees are interested in having direct deposit for their paychecks. He suggests the Town get started arranging it as many places already have this in place. The Board agreed to have bookkeeping begin the process of putting this into practice.
